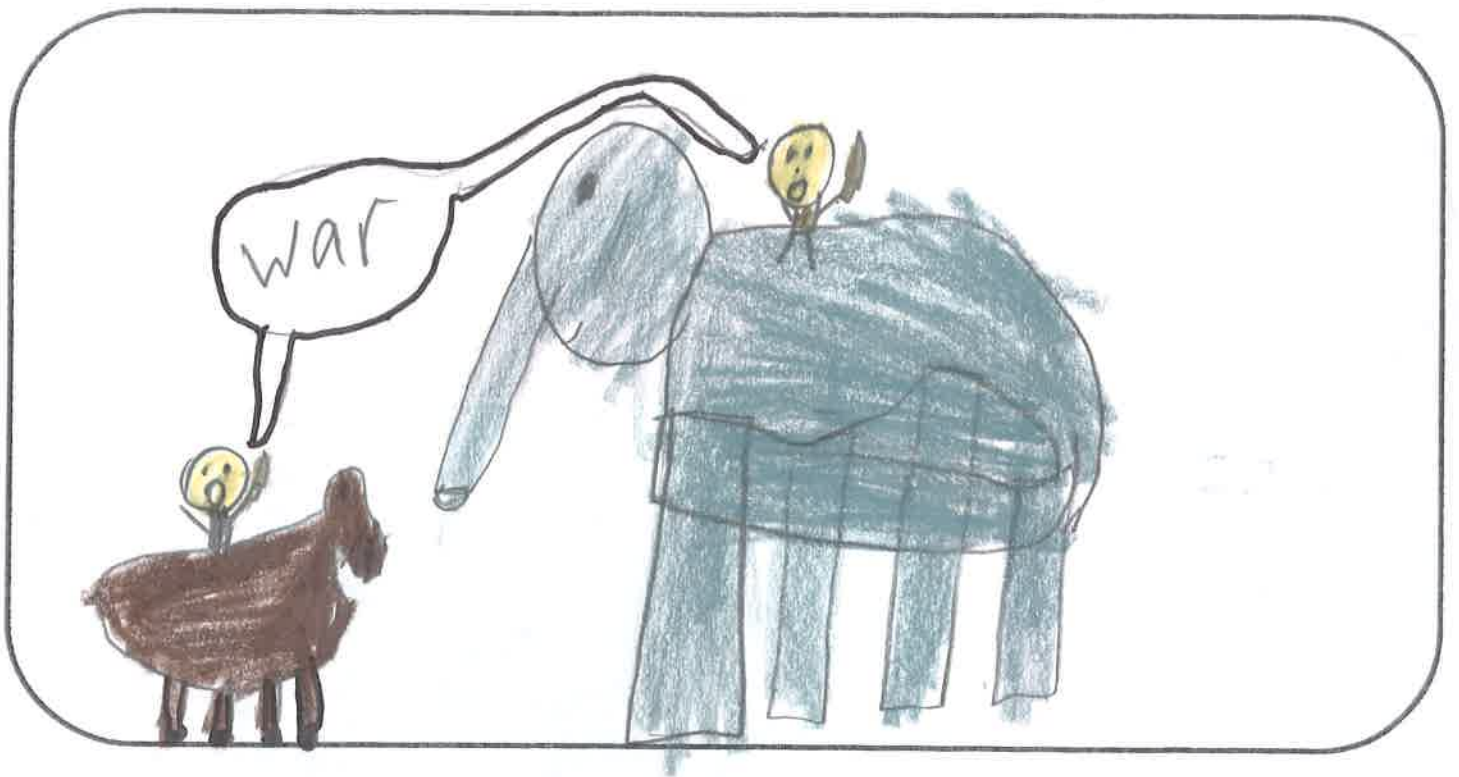

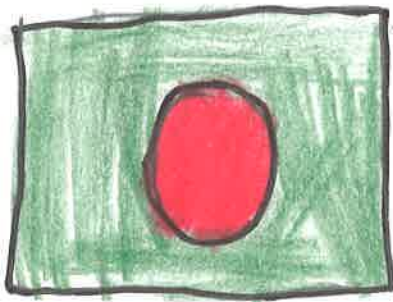
Bordering countries



The bordering countries of India are China, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, and Myanmar.

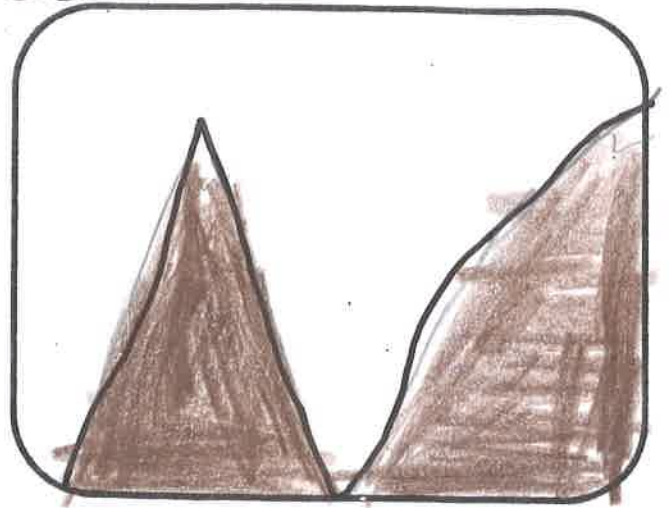

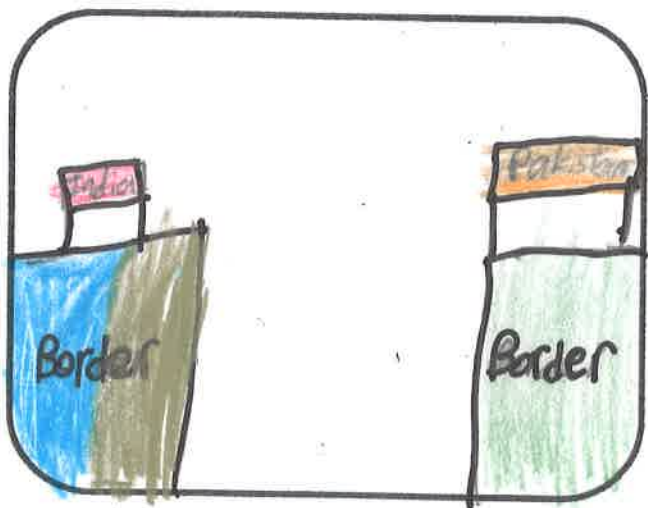

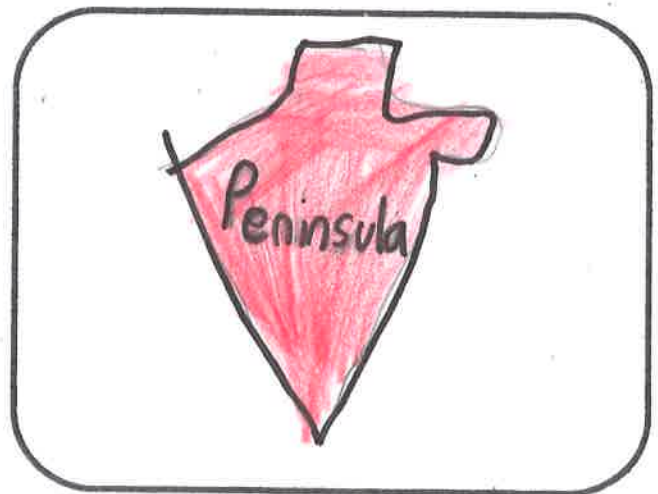
Bangladesh is not a part of India.



The Himalayas belong to Nepal.

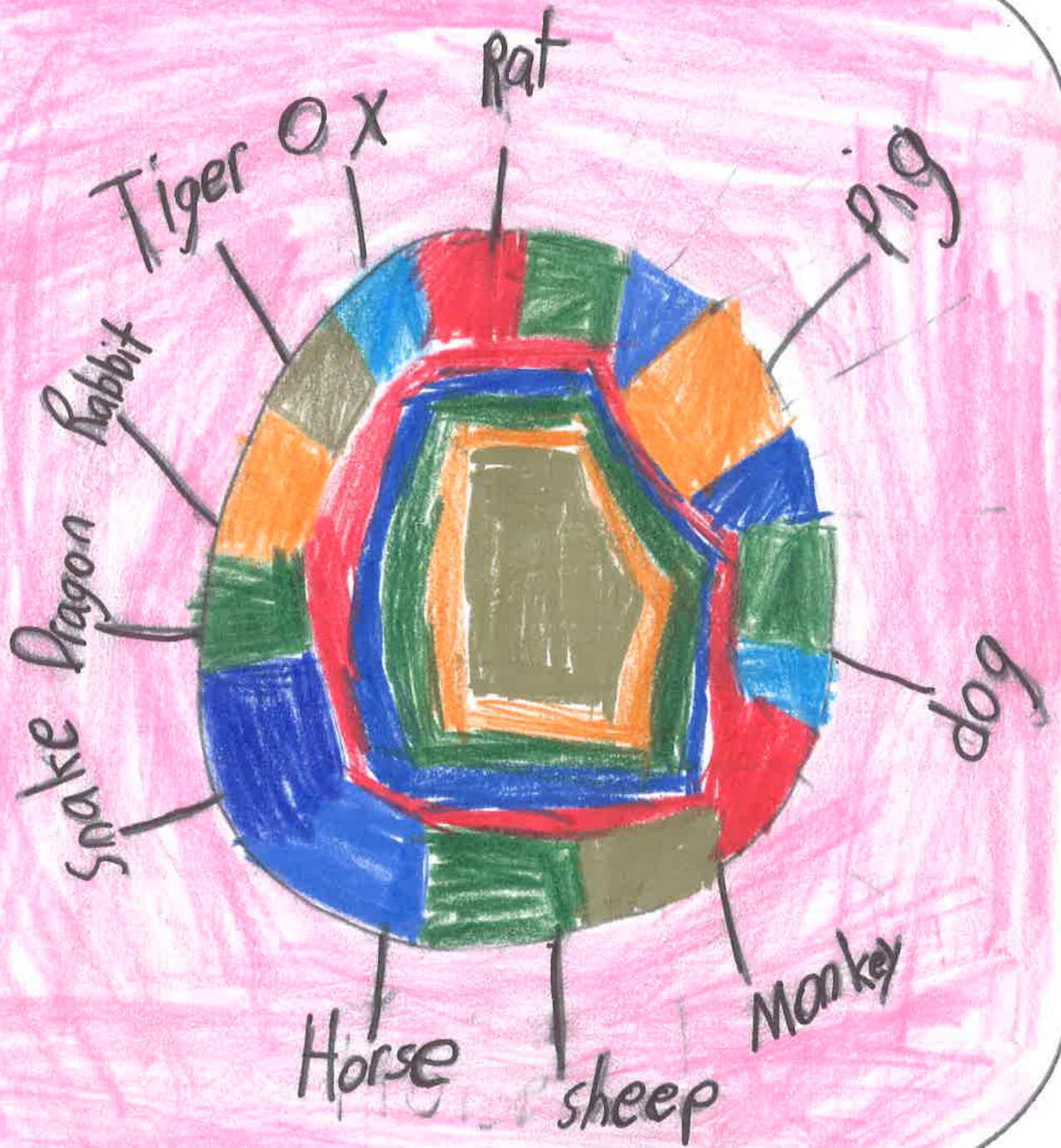


When you go in a train from Pakistan to India you can see the border.



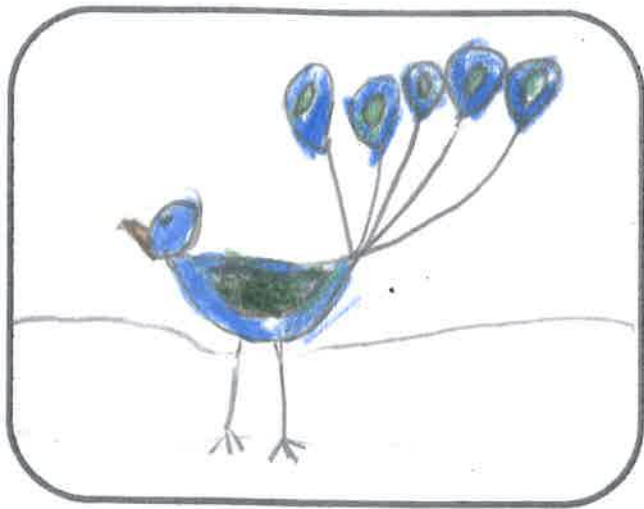
Myanmar is a Peninsula.

Facts About China

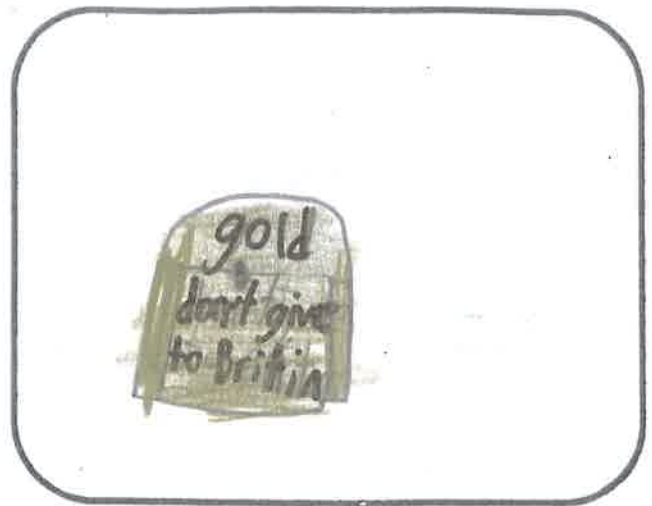


People who are Chinese have an animal after their birth. Each year there is an animal.

Peacocks are India's national birds.

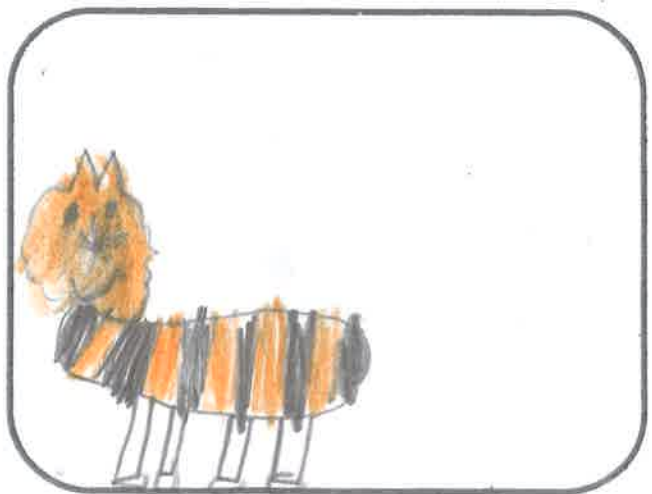


India has the most gold in the world.

Two Festivals

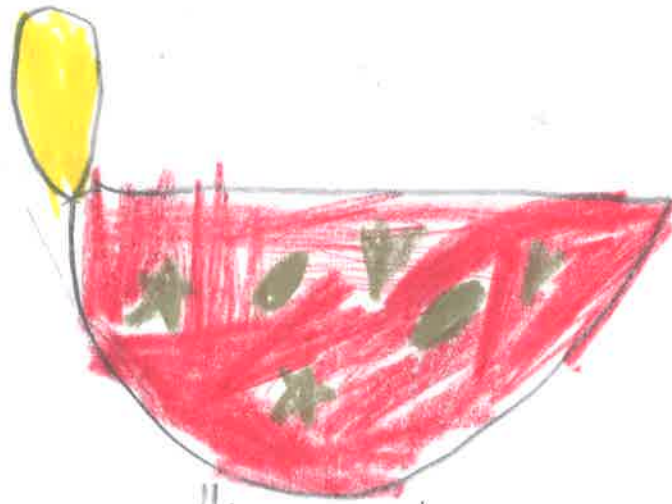


Ganpati is an elephant god. They named a festival after him. Ganpati lasts for ten days.



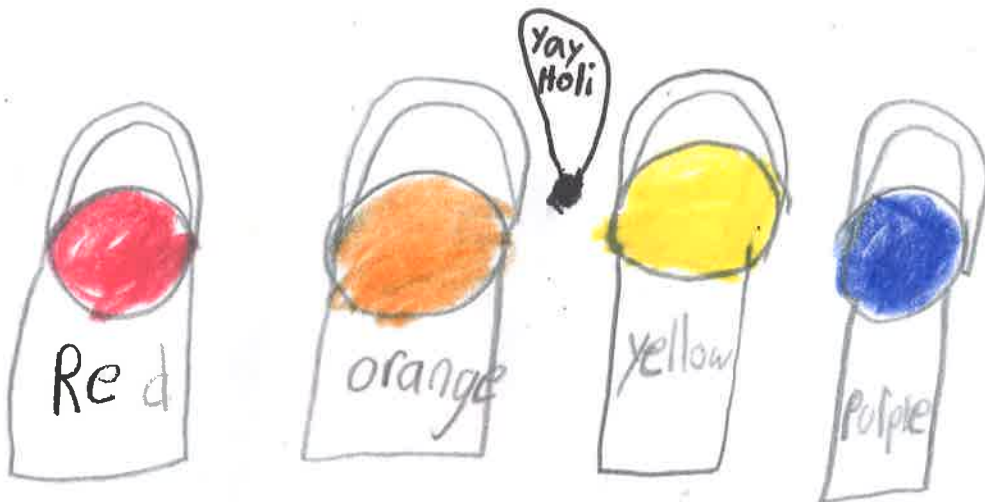
Dussehra is when three gods formed together and defeated an evil bull monster.

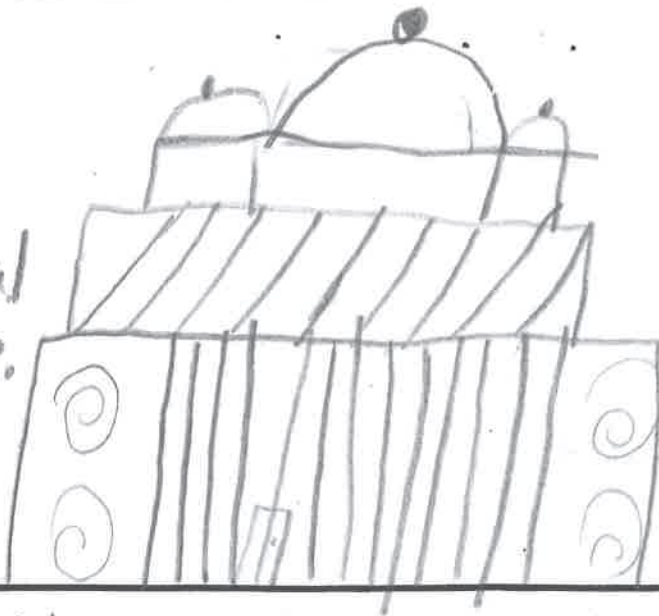
Diwali is the festival of lights. When you look outside you can see diyas on the roads and lanterns in the sky.



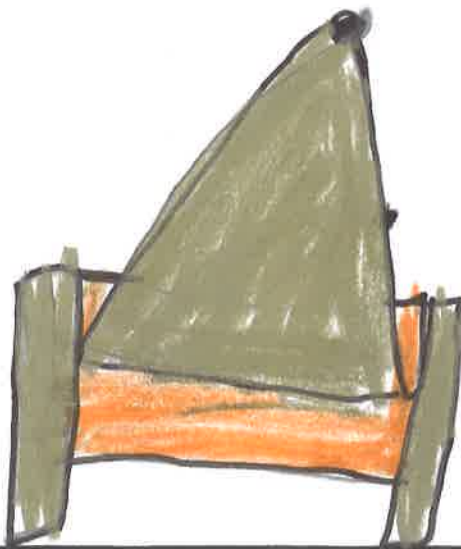
Holi is the festival of colors. People celebrate Holi by throwing color powder around.

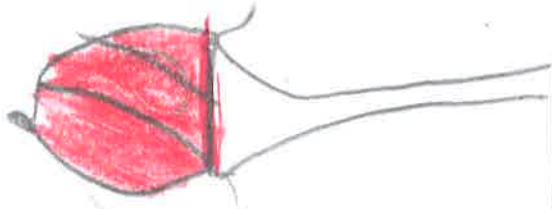


The Gate Way Of India is where Columbus
